Driving Directions:

For GPS purposes use
483 West Main Street, Huntington, NY
11743

From Western Long Island via Long Island Expressway:

Long Island Expressway to Exit 41N.
Take Rte106-107 North to fork, bear
right on Rte. 106. Proceed
approximately 3.5 miles to Rte. 25A
(Northern Blvd). Go East on 25A, 5.9
miles thru Cold Spring Harbor, to Club
on left.

From Eastern Long Island:

Northern State Pkwy West. Exit 42
North- Deer Park Rd (Huntington Exit).
At light, cross over heading toward
Huntington. Continue on Deer Park
Road (later changes into Deer Park Ave)
North. Pass over Rte. 25, (Deer Park
Ave turns into Park Ave) to 25A/Main
Street. At 25A make a left and head
westbound for 1.5 miles (thru the town
of Huntington). Huntington Country
Club will be on your right. Look for the
entrance immediately after Main Street
Nursery.

OR:

Coming from Route 110 North, make
left on 25A/Main Street heading
westbound, and proceed 8/10 of a mile.
Huntington Country Club will be on you
right. Look for the entrance immediately
after Main Street Nursery.

Welcome to Historic Huntington Country Club

Huntington Country Club (HCC) is a private, member-owned Club located midway between Huntington Village and Cold Spring Harbor on Long Island's North Shore. In 1910, a group of local and nationally prominent industrialists, financiers and philanthropists and their associates acquired 144 acres of land, which constitute the Club and its grounds today. Their aim was to establish a first-rate golf course, along with other recreational facilities, to meet the needs of a growing and increasingly prosperous community: a golf course in which they and future generations of members could take great pride.

To achieve their vision, the noted golf course architect Devereux Emmet was engaged to design and oversee construction of an 18 hole golf course on "this beautifully situated land with its fine natural mounds and deep rapidly sloping valleys and inequality of grade so attractive and sought after by knowledgeable golfers."

Today, this exceptionally well-maintained jewel of a course stands in splendid witness to that early vision. Through the years, more recreational amenities have been added to address the needs and interests of the Club's members. Included among them are 4 Har-Tru tennis courts, a 5 court platform tennis facility, past and future host to the American Platform Tennis Association National Championships, and an affiliated Winter Club with an attractive ice skating and hockey complex.

Golf Attire

All members, their children and guests are required to adhere to the Club's dress code. This dress code is mandatory for all players. Printing on all shirts must be inconspicuous and confined to logos and simple emblems. Improperly dressed golfers will be asked to change before playing. If you are in doubt concerning your attire, please check with the Golf Shop before starting play.

Men & Boys: Shirts with collars and sleeves, slacks, golf shorts or Bermuda shorts are considered proper attire. Tank Tops, cut-offs, sweat pants, jeans, bathing suits, short-shorts, tennis shorts or other athletic shorts are not appropriate and therefore NOT permitted. CARGO PANTS and CARGO SHORTS are also NOT permitted. Caps or visors are NOT permitted to be worn backwards and must be removed while in the Clubhouse.

Ladies & Girls: Permitted are, collared shirts with or without sleeves and collarless shirts but they must have sleeves. Slacks, Capri length pants, shorts, and skirts. NOT PERMITTED are: Cropped tops, halter tops, tank tops, t-shirts, sweat pants, denim jeans, tennis dresses, athletic shorts, short-shorts, cut-off shorts, low rise pants or shorts which expose midriff.



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RACQUET SPORTS

Proper tennis attire and tennis shoes required. Collared shirts for men and boys. For platform tennis, proper court shoes are required. No smoking in the chalet.

DINING DRESS CODE

Jackets for gentlemen are required for all evening dining in the Grill Room and Trophy Room (unless designated as an informal event). In the Main Dining Room, gentlemen are required to wear jackets and ties for all evening dining (unless designated as an informal event). Dresses or dress pants are considered appropriate attire for ladies. Children 14 years and older will adhere to the dress code for gentlemen; younger children are encouraged to do so.

“Casual” attire is permitted for lunch throughout the club house and for evening dining on the Patio and in Ray’s Room. Casual attire includes golf clothes (i.e. Bermuda length shorts and a collared shirt for men) and tennis clothes. Men and young gentlemen are required to remove hats while inside the Clubhouse and on the patio. Under no circumstances are hats to be worn backwards anywhere on Club grounds.

A member will be totally responsible for the conduct and attire of his or her guest.

CELL PHONES AND RELATED DEVICES

Use of cell phones and smart phones for voice conversations are permitted only in the privacy of your car and in the Clubhouse locker rooms.

Smartphones for texting, emails and access to websites are prohibited in all common areas of the Clubhouse (Grill Room, Trophy Room, Main Dining Room, hallways) and preferably concealed from view. Use of a smartphone as a camera is permitted with discretion. Kindles, iPads, etc. shall be considered to be smartphones for these purposes except when they are being used as e-book readers.

If a member or guest is required to make or accept an emergency call, email or text, the Dining Room Manager or a member of the staff can direct the member or guest to a private area of the Club, away from the activity areas where the call, email or text message can be completed.

PLEASE NOTE

No one under the age of 21 is permitted in Ray’s Room or to sit at any bar.
The Board of Directors has adopted a smoke free policy for the Clubhouse and Patio.
The Club cannot be responsible for the loss of personal property.
